

Mumbai is both old and modern, rich and poor. The streets are full of people doing business, selling snacks and clothes or just living there.

Money is everywhere in modern Mumbai. India's most important businesses and banks have their headquarters there. The Bollywood film industry produces more films than Hollywood in Los Angeles.

Modern skyscrapers and new shopping malls are right next to slums. 60% of the population left with no running water, no electricity and no sanitation.

Visiting Mumbai

Mumbai is on the West coast. The wet season is from June to September. Between November and February it is a little cooler and drier.

The city is best at sunrise and sunset, when the color of stone buildings change jizz from gold to arrange and pink. The cheapest and easiest transported by bus. Trains can be crowded and dangerous.

Multicultural Mexico City

Inside the White House



The White House, sixteen hundred Pennsylvania Avenue, Washington DC, is the most famous address in America. It is where the United States president works, but it's also his private home where he lives with his family. He has children's birthday parties, holiday dinners and weddings in this world- famous building.

The building

In the West wing are the staff officers. The president's own office comma the Oval Office is also there. It has three . large windows behind the president's desk comma and there is a fireplace at the other hand.

Each president chooses new curtains, new furniture and a special new carpet. There are pictures of old presidents on the wall and there is the famous desk a gift from British Queen Victoria in eighteen eighty



The White House day by day

The White House is open to visitors for stop it is free. About six thousand people a day visit. The president meet special guests in the East room and he talks to journalist in the press room.

About a hundred and fifty ... people work for the president in West Wing and for the first lady in the East wing. Another ninety-nine .. people look after the building day and night.

There are a hundred and thirty-two ... rooms, thirty-five ... bathrooms comma and five ... kitchens all on six ... floors. There are four ... elevators the state dining room is big enough for hundred and forty ... guests

Outside, gardeners grow fruit and vegetable. There is also a tennis court, a jogging track comma and a swimming pool. Inside at the movie theater, a billiard room, a bowling alley and a library. As former president Reagan said "The White House is like an 8 star hotel!"
